DEFINITIONS OF TERMS FOUND IN THIS SCHEDULE

3 Distinct means 3 differently named roses, (eg, Peace, Moonstone & St Patrick) **1 Cultivar** has the same meaning as 1 variety (same name).

NND means "Not Necessarily Distinct" which allows the exhibitor to mix or match varieties in the exhibit to suit the available roses (eg, 3 Stems NND would allow a choice of either 3 distinct cultivars, 3 of a single cultivar, or 2 of 1 cultivar plus 1 of another different cultivar).

Stem: A stem is defined as an original new growth which carries one bloom or one bud and has received no check from pinching, stopping or pruning from the time of starting into growth to flowering. Disbudding is not regarded as a check to growth under this definition. The stem should be proportionate in thickness and length to the size of the bloom it supports. STEM count is determined at the point of emergence of the stems from the top of the Society's containers.

Cut: A cut is similar to a stem (original new growth) that carries one bloom and bud or buds, <u>or more</u> than one bloom with or without side buds.

Any H.T. may be shown as an exhibition H.T. rose. However, roses in this category are primarily judged on form and condition ie <u>Form</u> (4) Points; <u>Condition</u> (3) Points; <u>Size</u> (2) Points; and <u>Presentation</u> (1) Point.

Decorative Hybrid Tea Roses: All hybrid tea cultivar roses can be exhibited in any hybrid tea class. There are **no points for form or size** in Decorative Rose Classes. Therefore, high centres and perfect spiral petals are not judged in the Decorative Class. The ten points for Decorative Classes are: <u>Condition</u> (4) Points; <u>Beauty</u> (3) Points; <u>Foliage</u> (2) Points; and <u>Presentation</u> (1) Point.

SPRING DECORATIVE HYBRID TEA CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 1: 3 containers of Decorative HT Roses, 3-5 Blooms per container - each container distinct cultivars (open to all HT roses, but judged as decorative standard)

SPRING COMPOSITE CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 2: Triple entry (i.e. 3 containers):

- (a) 6 Stems Decorative HT Roses, NND in 1 container;
- (b) 3 Stems/Cuts of Floribunda Roses NND in 1 container;
- (c) 3 Stems/Cuts Miniature OR Miniflora Roses, NND in 1 container..

SPRING FLORIBUNDA CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 3: Triple entry:

- (a) 3 to 6 Cuts of Floribunda Roses of one cultivar in 1 container,
- (b) 3 Stems/Cuts of Floribunda Roses of one cultivar in 1 container, and
- (c) 3 Stems of Floribunda Roses of one cultivar, in 1 container each segment (i.e. a, b, and c) to be a different cultivar.

SPRING MINIFLORA CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 4: Triple entry:

- (a) 3 to 6 Cuts of Miniflora Roses of one cultivar in 1 container,
- (b) 3 Stems/Cuts of Miniflora Roses of one cultivar in 1 container, &
- (c) 3 Stems of Miniflora Roses of one cultivar, in 1 container <u>each</u> <u>segment (a, b, and c) to be a different cultivar.</u>

QRS CHAMPIONSHIPS (open to all exhibitors)

SPRING MINIATURE CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 5: Triple entry:

- (a) 6 Stems/Cuts of Miniature Roses, 3 Cultivars, 2 of each Cultivar, in 1 container;
- (b) 3 Stems/Cuts Miniature Roses, Distinct, in 1 container;
- (c) 3 Stems/Cuts Miniature Roses, 1 Cultivar, in 1 container.

SPRING H.T. EXHIBITION CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 6: 6 H.T. Exhibition Roses, NND, minimum of 3 different cultivars (Open to all HT roses but judged by Exhibition standards)

SPRING SUPER SIX DECORATIVE CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 7: 6 Decorative Hybrid Tea Roses, Distinct Cultivars.

(Open to all HT roses but judged by Decorative standards)

DIVISION A COMPOSITE CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 8: 3 Segments:

- (a) 3-5 Decorative HTs, NND, in 1 container;
- (b) 2 Stems/Cuts of Floribunda Roses, NND, in 1 container;
- (c) 2 Stems/Cuts of Miniature Roses OR Miniflora Roses, NND, in 1 container.

(Open to all HT roses, but judged by Decorative standards)

*** Note: any rose in a single vase is eligible for championship consideration.

DIVISION A (formerly DIV. I & II)

HYBRID TEA EXHIBITION BLOOMS

(Open to all Exhibitors except Novices - refer to back of schedule for changes)

Class 9: 3 Roses, Distinct Cultivars

Class 10: 3 Roses, 1 Cultivar

Class 11: 1 Red Rose

Class 12: 1 White/Cream Rose

Class 13: 1 Pink Rose Class 14: 1 Yellow Rose

Class 15: 1 Rose. Any colour other than above, including blend

NOTES:

• Exhibition roses must be staged in **separate containers**, ie, 3 Roses, Distinct Cultivars require 3 containers.

Any HT may be entered as an Exhibition Rose, however, roses in this category are primarily judged on form.

a) Form: 4 Points,b) Condition: 3 Points

c) Size: 2 Points d) Presentation: 1 Point.

SHOW CONDITIONS OF ENTRY-1

The Auditorium will be open for exhibitors at 6:30am Saturday. All exhibits must be staged by 9:25 am, when all exhibitors must leave the exhibition area. Any exhibit not then completed will not be allowed to compete. Judging shall commence at 9:30 am. No exhibit shall be removed before closing time on Sunday without the permission of the Chief Steward.

All roses must be grown by the exhibitor - <u>no purchased roses can be</u> considered for any QRS award.

All roses will be judged under National Rose Society of Australia standards - copy available from the QRS Chief Judge. If a Show Schedule specification conflicts with the N.R.S.A. standards, then the schedule specification shall prevail. Wiring of stems permitted for all Exhibition Bloom Classes, full blooms, 3 stages of opening and where otherwise specified in the schedule but should not be obtrusive. Note: No other artificial aids allowed above top of container. Pellets: 1 point deducted for each pellet found - 2 or more pellets lead to disqualification.

The decision of the Judges will be final.

- All blooms exhibited must be grown by the exhibitor, except in the Floral Art Section.
- All exhibits except those in the Floral Art Section, must be staged in approved containers.
- Care will be taken with the exhibits, but the Committee will not be responsible for any loss, accident or damage to any exhibit.

LATE ENTRIES permitted ONLY IF SPACE IS AVAILABLE — any late entries staged without the express permission of the Chief Steward on the morning of the show will be disqualified. Exhibitors are not limited in the number of entries in any one Class unless otherwise specified in the schedule. Exhibits MUST have a variety card for each ITEM with the Exhibitor's number written on the back (to preserve anonymity) — both available from Chief Steward/Deputy Chief Steward.

Any exhibitor who has exhibited in Division A cannot revert to Division B/Novice (classes 16-21) All exhibitors may enter any other class in the schedule. All classes from 21 onwards are open.

PLEASE READ THE SCHEDULE CAREFULLY as significant changes have been made to the schedule since the QRS 2023 Autumn Rose Show.

Division I and Division II have been combined as **Division A with Division B**, the Novice Section. <u>Open Sections are open to all exhibitors</u>, including Novices. A **Novice** is defined as an exhibitor who has not won more than three major/best exhibit awards in at any shows.

These changes mean that exhibitors will no longer graduate from Division II to Division I. Secondly, despite dropping a number of classes, there will be greater scope for all growers to exhibit their roses and be considered for a major award. The CHAMPION and RESERVE CHAMPION EXHIBITION BLOOM will be selected from Classes 6, 9-15, & 16.

These amendments were made in response to the declining number of entries in Division I classes over the past few years. Novice exhibits are now eligible for consideration in Championship classes.

The Champion Exhibition and Reserve Champion Exhibition HTs will be selected from the best 6-8 roses, removed from the show benches to a neutral position where judges, who have no personal interest in these roses, will conduct a secret ballot.

The Queensland Rose Society uses the American Rose Society Classification of Roses as per *Modern Roses 12* (available from the Chief Steward) as our guidelines. Please refer to this for any points of Contention.

All exhibits become the property of the Queensland Rose Society Inc with the exception of Floral Art, seedlings and special exhibits.
